He has been cataloging items in our collection, has helped with organizing our storeroom and our documentation about artifacts, and has scanned some of our photographs. He has also done some research for us, including the following on Alexis Brown:

Alexis Brown and what we know about him

Alexis Brown of Mt. Healthy was a mere boy at the onset of the Civil War. He joined the Grand Army of the Republic (G.A.R.) when he was thirteen years old and was placed in the 39th Ohio Volunteer Infantry. His service in the Civil War seems to have been unremarkable except that he was so young. Most of our information on him comes from the National Parks Service. Their archive shows that Brown was a Private for most of the war. He spent three years in the 39th Ohio, then reenlisted in 1865 and was put in the 193rd Ohio.

From the National Parks Service's archive, we know that the 39th Ohio was trained in St. Louis in the late summer of 1861. Brown followed the 39th Ohio for most of the war. The 39th fought in the western theater; early on they were in the Army of the Mississippi



and later they were put in the Army of the Tennessee under the command of General William Tecumseh Sherman.

In July of 1864, Brown fought in the battle of Atlanta, where he was injured. Our understanding of Brown's life over the next six months grows murky. We know that he reenlisted and was put in the 193rd Ohio, and there may have been a short period when he was in the 188th Ohio as well. This is not known. We do know that the 193rd Ohio saw no combat, but they were placed in the Army of the Shenandoah and were mustered out of service in Winchester Virginia, which is at the northern peak of the state.

Brown went on to serve five terms as Mayor of Mt. Healthy. Alexis died in September of 1931 at the age of
